# Beware of Fraudulent Accident Management Companies

Deceptive practices in the motor claims industry are on the rise, with fraudulent accident management companies misleading drivers by posing as insurers.

These businesses promise "free" hire cars, towing, and quick claims handling, only to leave customers facing inflated costs, substandard repairs, and even having their vehicles withheld.

Many unsuspecting drivers fall into this trap when searching online for their insurer's contact details, unknowingly calling a third-party company instead. These businesses often use misleading ads and aggressive tactics, intercepting claims and complicating the process. In some cases, insurers have had to take legal action to recover customer vehicles.

Glenn Rowe, Manager of Counter-Fraud and Investigations at RACQ Insurance, warns that "these companies' tactics are becoming more sophisticated... We've seen fraudulent schemes where they will try cold calling customers, door knocking, advertising online with incentives, and working with credit hire businesses to refer details over to accident management companies."

These practices not only harm individuals but also contribute to rising insurance premiums for everyone. The Insurance Council of Australia is calling for stronger regulations to combat these unethical operators.

A spokesperson for the Insurance Council of Australia (ICA) emphasised concerns, stating that "while these companies claim to offer a smooth and cost-free experience for not-at-fault drivers... they operate in a regulatory grey area, allowing them to exploit loopholes in consumer law as well as financial services regulations related to claims handling activities."

To protect yourself, always contact your broker directly after an accident. If a company pressures you into unnecessary towing, repair services, or hire cars, verify their legitimacy with your broker before proceeding. Your broker is your best source of reliable claims assistance—don't let deceptive businesses take advantage of you in a vulnerable moment.
